**Stephen Ministry Incorporates A Caring Ministry**

For many years now, The First Church has maintained an active Stephen Ministry Program, where lay people are trained as Christian caregivers. In several waves, each of our Stephen Ministers participated in 50 hours of training, and were equipped with some tools and skills to walk with people who are going through a difficult time. The current Stephen Ministers include Lorraine Follis (leader), Lorraine Angel, Sue Burgess, Jack Casteel, Janet Fischer, Jim Scofield, and Sharon Thomas. We receive and provide support to Pastor Ian Holland and Community Minister, Rev. Bill Simpson.

While we still offer this one-on-one caregiving ministry for those who express interest in having a dedicated Stephen Minister, we realize that there is a need for caregiving that is shorter term. Maybe you need to talk to someone to share a problem or dilemma you are facing? Maybe you need to understand the resources that might be available for some problem. Maybe you need a hand with a sudden situation, or just need to vent. Perhaps you need a ride, or a meal, or a chat over a cup of coffee or tea.

Some others in our church have stepped up to join the Stephen Ministers in this work, and we call them Caring Ministers. We have started to meet monthly for trainings, so that all the pieces will be in place by the time Pastor Ian leaves on sabbatical in April. It is exciting to announce that Dale Orzalli, David Foye, Lynn Lindsey, Bruce Mueller, and Betsy Pugh will be joining the Caring Team. They bring a number of interesting new perspectives and life experiences to our group. Several of our teens will return to camp in Sharon, CT that is affiliated with the UCC. It has been offering camp programs to youth ages 9 to 19 since 1957. The Executive Director, the Rev. Ryan Gackenheimer, commented on the changes that his leadership will bring. For each of the seven weeks of summer, there are five different tracks (for various age levels and interests).
